

FORGOTTEN TIMES 1930 22.5' Dodge Runabout Owned by Jim & Nancy Donald

Dodge introduced wooden boats from 1923-1930. Horace E. Dodge, son of one of the Dodge Motor Bros. built these boats at the Horace E. Dodge Boat and Plane Company in New Port News, VA. In 1930 the fleet production was 16' to 45' cruisers. The 21'6" runabout was said to "ride pretty as a gull, turn at full speed, bank as smoothly as a swooping plane and keeps as dry". If it did not have the name Dodge, you could scarcely believe the magic in this boat's performance. There are approximately 7 of these runabouts remaining today; they originally sold for \$2,100 FOB Factory.



DECO 1930 19' Dee Wite Split Cockpit Runabout Owned by B.K. Powell

Dee Wites were manufactured by the Dwight Lumber Company in Detroit Michigan. from 1929 to 1936. The Dwight Lumber Company provided lumber to Chris Craft and Century, in the late 1920's the Company decided to manufacture their own line of pleasure boats, hiring a marine architect to design the boats and naming the boat division 'Dee Wite" a variation of "Dwight" Dee Wite had one model in 1929, a 14 foot enclosed outboard, the next year (1930) they came out with 7 models. DECO is a 19 ' model #6 split cockpit runabout. Dee Wite's were known for their sleek design-being narrow, with a 8" crown to their decks and a swept back windshield-which was unusual for the times, being that most windshields were straight up akin to the automobiles of that era.

Dee Wites were renowned for their "modern Art Deco" look, and construction. All were made with African Mahogany, with copper clinched nails and brass screws not hidden by bungs. The effect being that the sides of the boats "glistened" in the sunlight. The Dee Wite boat division prospered, but the effects of the Great Depression closed the doors of the parent Dwight Lumber Company taking the boat division with it in 1936.

To this day Dee Wite's are particularly rare boats, only a handful are known to exist. DECO may be the only Dee Wite on the West Coast. The majority of Dee Wites were sold in the Midwest and East coast. DECO was "discovered" in New Hampshire and transported to Spokane, where she went through a several year restoration process.

DECO sports 1800 of the copper clinched nails, she's powered by a 6 Volt, 6 cylinder 95 HP Gray Maine Phantom Engine (with a floor starter) and an original "ahooga" horn.

She now takes her place among all those mahogany classics of the past.



BETTY LOU 1938 19' Chris Craft Custom Owned by Lon & Betty McDonald

This 19 foot Chris Craft was a "barn find" in Pocatello Idaho. It had been restored in 1980 by Buck Bailey and placed in a garage for the next 34 years. It was advertised in the Thrifty Nickel in Pocatello and purchased by Lon and Betty McDonald in 2014. It was restored in 2015 by Wood Boat Endeavor in Post Falls.



BURGUNDY ROSE 1946 17' Chris Craft Custom Deluxe Owned by Rex & Emmie Lytle



Powered by 1958 Ford Interceptor marine V-8 engine Dark Mahogany finish which is consistent with the original production in 1946. Restoration in 2005 by Jim Winslow. We purchased the boat and named it in 2015.

The *Ruby Jo*, named for the owner's first granddaughter, hull number 37758, is a 13' 1955 Lyman runabout. The manufacturer, Lyman Boat Company, was located in Sandusky, Ohio and existed from the late 1880's until about 1970. Lyman boats, with their deep hull and lapstrake construction, were designed for the choppy waters of the Great Lakes. Lyman boats are rare in the western states. The boat is powered by a professionally restored 1956 Johnson Javelin, 30 HP. Restoration by Silver Lake Marine, Toronto, Canada. Period authentic seat covers by Boise Car Upholstery .



BANDIDO 1956 16' Crooks Runabout Owned by Glenn Johnston

Manufactured in 1956 Northern California the Bay area. I acquired Bandido in 2006 and had Jim Winslow restore the boat.



GRAN-DEL SPECIAL 1966 19' Century Arabian Owned by Jim & Kathy Grant

DR ELLEN 2015 30' Coeur d'Alene Custom Coeur 300 Owned by Jerry and Donna Gilbreath


Dr. Ellen is a Coeur Custom 30' Gentleman's Runabout. She is crafted from Sapele Mahogany, the boat is 30 feet long with an 8'6" beam and a 20 degree dead rise.

She is powered by Mercury 8.2 Mag, 380 hp, fuel injected engine controlled by finger touch electronic controls and monitored with Mercruiser's smart craft gauges. She is pushed by a Bravo 3 outdrive, and nudged when needed with a Vetus bow thruster.


The custom interior has pedestal captains seats and U-shape aft seating area. She is dressed out with a custom bent safety glass windshield bordered with a hand bent stainless steel framework. It has easy access to the cockpit through a side entry door, and is followed up with an integrated teak swim platform for access to the water.



BLEW BY YOU 1947 22' Chris Craft U22 Owned by Gary & Cathy Lyons

The original boat was delivered to Cedar Rapids, Iowa. After many years of use and misuse, it was found in Riggins, Idaho in 2010 in poor condition. The original Chris Craft factory boat specifications indicated a mahogany deck, white hull and blue seating with blonde wood interior. We have kept the same theme here, only the interior configuration



has been changed to include captain's chairs, a mid-deck bench and a mahogany deck addition that partially covers the engine. We also added a swim deck to the exterior.

This was a very popular post-war boat. The Chris Craft Company manufactured 2082 boats between 1946 and 1954. This boat was completely restored from 2014-2015 by Chris Kirk and Gary Lyons at Chris' shop in McCall.

Prior owners did a complete amateur restoration on completed in 2013. It is a very nice looking boat, winning a first place at the 2013 Tahoe Concours.

MARIDEAN R 1953 19' Chris Craft Holiday Owned by Stephen & Claire Ryberg

Eric and Maridean Ryberg purchased the Maridean R from Covey Marine in Salt Lake City, Utah in 1953. She spent her early years pulling water skiers at full throttle on the waters of Hebgen Lake, Montana.

The Maridean R was first brought to Payette Lake in the 80's by Steve Ryberg, a son of the original owners. During this time she continued to pull water skiers and also became a favorite cocktail cruiser.

In 2005 a new bottom was installed by Jim Winslow and Maridean's fourth engine was installed by Bob Brewer. She remains a user boat and classic cocktail cruiser.

This boat was purchased in Sacramento, CA and has been restored by Jim Winslow of McCall, ID. Carolita has all original wood and the original engine. There were only five of these boats made; the hull number of this boat is #5 - the last one off the line.





JEANETTE 1957 17' Chris Craft Owned by Jon & Kathy Seetin

Jeanette is a 1956 17 foot Chris-Craft Sportsman, bought directly from the Chris-Craft

Company and shipped to McCall by railcar. When the boat arrived, it was on a cradle, covered by paper. We put the wooden cradle on a 4 wheel trailer which was it's transportation for nearly 30 years. Jeanette has remained in the Seetin family since her purchase and has never been off Payette Lake. Many years ago, she had a slight facelift...the original interior was changed to red.

In 2013, Don Hardy restored the boat to her original interior and wood finish. The hours on the motor as of July 2014 are approximately 412 hours. Many adults today remember learning to ski behind the boat as children. Since the boat had never been named, my wife Kathy suggested we name the boat when we had it restored. Because my Mother,



Jeanette Seetin, taught numerous children to ski behind this boat, we felt it appropriate to name the boat in her honor. Her beauty lives on and we continually hear from young and old how beautiful "Jeanette" is.

The JOHN B 1957 17' Chris Craft Cavalier Owned by Greg and GayLynn Bengtson

So, I bought this boat five years ago as a recreational driver that wouldn't depreciate while I owned it. It was in adequate shape, floated and the engine started so I had no intention to do any restoration, just use it and enjoy. However, owning a wooden boat compels one to join the boat club which compelled me to enter the Sandpoint ACBS boat show last year. After seeing the gorgeous bright and shiny restorations on display, I realized, as my wife said, I was living in the ghettos with this boat, prompting an eight month refinishing of literally every-





CHRISTINE 1966 21' Chris Craft Super Sport Owned by Brian & Lan Ellsworth

Delivered to Lake Pend Oreille in 1954. Last 1954 Owens Cruiser on water today. Totally restored by Jim Winslow in 1995.



CUTWATER 1958 32' Chris Craft Cruiser Owned by Shore Lodge

Cutwater spent most of its life in Portland Oregon, arriving on Lake Coeur d'Alene in 1996. The boat was built of double planked mahogany in Pompano Beach, Florida with an interior of mahogany and a floor of teak and holly. The 32' Constellation was designed to be a luxury family day cruiser which is exactly what it is being used for today. Cutwater has been enjoying its new home this year on Payette Lake working as a cruise boat for Shore Lodge. The name Cutwater comes from the boat builder's term for the piece of metal that curves down the centerline of the bow and "cuts the water".



JOYRIDE 1970 16.5' Wayfarer Day Sail / Racer Owned by Darryl & Mary White

The Wayfarer is wooden hulled, fractional rigged, sailing one-design racing dinghy. Designed in 1957, by Ian Proctor, and built in England. Currently 11,000 boats registered in

the class internationally. The boat is 16' in length, 6' beam and 22' mast. Wood construction was ceased in 1965, currently available in fiberglass, one manufacturer in England will build a wooden boat at an excessive cost.

This Boat , Joyride, was built in the 70's from a kit by a wood hobbyist in San Francisco. Being a craftsman, not a sailor the boat was sailed only twice, then stored [unattended], in a garage in Napa Valley, Ca. for 27 years. We found the boat in 2015 with substantial wood rot structural damage. After 8 months and several hundred hours of caring and patient restoration, we have a fun and functional sailing craft.





1956 16' Starline Owned by Richard & Amy Holm

Clint Warren (current owner's great uncle) purchased the boat only as a finished hull from

the Starline company of Costa Mesa, California, in 1956. Warren, a mechanical engineer and owner of Cornell Pumps (a large industrial irrigation pump manufacturer) completed the boat in his Portland-based shop. The boat is powered by a 1956 Pontiac 316 that was obtained from a then new automobile that had recently been wrecked. With speed in mind, the Pontiac is linked to a freestanding heavy-duty Paragon 3XE transmission then to a Walter vdrive. After completing initial water testing on the Willamette River in the spring of 1957 the boat was trailered to Payette Lake



where it was used by the Warren family mainly for waterskiing through the late-1970s.

SARAH JO 1969 19' OMC/Evinrude Rogue II Owned by Frederic & Brooke Lynes

Our boat is a 1969 Evinrude Rogue II 210 hp, with the original 307 cid. Chevy engine and original Electric Shift outdrive. It only has 175 hours. It was purchased by Mr. William Schneider new in San Angelo, TX, in very early 1970, and kept in immaculate condition. We purchased the boat in 2013, and the only thing I have done to it is replace the water



pump and seals on the outdrive, found new old stock wiring harnesses for the engine compartment and replaced the tilt motor and shaft.

Sarah Jo named after Brook's mom, who passed away in 2014.

IN YOUR DREAMS 1970 Chris Craft Corsair Owned by Kris and Arleen Kotter

This is a classic 1970 Chris Craft 17-foot Corsair. This model was produced by Chris Craft for watersports, skiing, and general speeboat style running on lakes and rivers. It had robust power, true inboard configuration, and very modern styling. The model is extremely rare, only 53 hulls like



this one were produced. This is Hull # 002 Power was from the 327Q V8, with 230 horsepower. I have diligently been restoring this Boat with the help of B&B boats in Melba, Idaho. Brad and Brent Hewlett were always there with advice and help in making this project happen in preparation for my beautiful Wife Arleen 50th birthday. Upholstery was completed by Taylormade Upholstery in Boise Idaho.



1972 18' Century Resorter Owned by Joe & Heidi Putney

We have always wanted a classic and found this one in the spring.

We have been enjoying the work to bring it back to original as close as possible. The goal was to make look as good, but more than that, we wanted to enjoy the boat with our family.

LOVE AMERICAN STYLE 1972 21' Campbell Day Cruiser Owned by Jerry & Lori Frank

I grew up with this boat as a kid it was my Uncle's boat that my Dad loved dearly (both have passed). She is a red white and blue, hand laid, wooden and fiberglass boat.

She was built by the Campbell brothers out of Burbank California. These boats are no longer made and rare to find a (Fiberclassic). She has an inboard with a 454 LS6 producing about 400 horse power and a V-drive. Her name is Love American Style!

The heavy metal flake is a special 'fading' design reportedly only mastered by Baja Boats. The metal flake, silver on the sides and fading into blue on top deck and lower hull presents a striking brilliance and reflects prismatic colors in direct sun.

Pre-dating the broad distribution of the competition ski, wakeboard and surf boats, this low-production, rare to the west, classic 70's ski boat holds a unique place in boating. Humorously once described too as "....a 70's James Bond boat"....and it kind of is!




