

LINDSAY MCCALL 1928 16' Dodge 16A Watercar Owned by Donald Hardy

I saw this boat back in 1967 when my father moved my brother and myself



from Massachusetts to Boise, Idaho. We lived next door to the Zamzows and the Browns on Fairview and Liberty. Chet Brown had this boat and a Cessna plane hanging in his small barn.

To me being a small boy, this was a cool place to hang out. 35 years later I

move back to Boise. I decided to stop by the old neighbor hood. The boat was still there. I bought it on the spot not knowing what it was or no knowledge in wood boats 12 years before I started McCall boat works.

Fast forward. Winter of 2016 we started and finished the restoration. Lindsay McCall is named after my Aunt Lindsay who fought a courageous battle with cancer. It is her memory and will be in the family to pass down.



FORGOTTEN TIMES 1930 22.5' Dodge Runabout Owned by Jim & Nancy Donald

Dodge introduced wooden boats from 1923-1930. Horace E. Dodge, son of one of the Dodge Motor Bros. built these boats at the Horace E. Dodge Boat and Plane Company in New Port News, VA. In 1930 the fleet production was 16' to 45' cruisers. The 21'6" runabout was said to "ride pretty as a gull, turn at full speed, bank as smoothly as a swooping plane and keeps as dry". If it did not have the name Dodge, you could scarcely believe the magic in this boat's performance. There are approximately 7 of these runabouts remaining today; they originally sold for \$2,100 FOB Factory.



WANNSEE 1941 17' Chris Craft Custom Deluxe

Owned by Whitney & Amy Gardiner

Wannsee (von,ze:) is a 1941 Chris-Craft 17' deluxe. She is equipped with her original triple carb KBL engine.

Edward Gardiner became the boats second owner in 1980. Dad was drawn to the barrel back design. He was responsible for the complete restoration and named her after his childhood home outside Berlin.

She spent many years on Lake Hopatcong, NJ at Wayne Mockfield's marina. Prior to his passing, he gave the boat to his youngest son, Whitney. With the help of Don and the folks at Mccall Boat Works, she is ready for her new life out west.



SKI-DAD'L 1949 14' Axtell Boat Works River Racer Owned by Anthony and Barbara Laidlaw

This 14' runabout was built in 1949 for Frank Thornton of Kelso, Washington. It was powered by a 35 h.p. Evinrude. Mr. Thornton was one of the original members of the Cowlitz Boating Club which spon-

sored many boat races well into the '60's. He named the boat Sandy after his daughter.

In1957 Maurice "Lucky" Laidlaw purchased Sandy. Later that year the Laidlaw family of four took this boat through the San Juan Islands and into Vitoria B.C. with other likeminded and equipped families.

By 1958, in the quest for more speed and more power to pull skiers. Lucky hung a Mercury Mark 78 (75 hp) motor on the transom and renamed her Ski-Dad'L because of the way she moved across the water.

Again in the quest for more speed, a 95 hp Mercury was given a test run on Ski-Dad'L in

1966. It was fast. So fast that Lucky's wife said it was too much engine for a boat that size and back on went the 75hp.

Lucky handed down Ski-Dad"L to his son Tony (the current owner) in 1975. The boat was stored in a

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
MARVELOUS 1953 18' Chris Craft Riviera

RUBY JO 1955 13' Lyman Runabout Owned by Joe & Celeste Miller

The Ruby Jo, named for the owner's first grand-daughter, hull number 37758, is a 13' 1955 Lyman runabout. The manufacturer, Lyman Boat Company, was located in Sandusky, Ohio and existed from the late 1880's until about 1970. Lyman boats, with their deep hull and lapstrake construction, were designed for the choppy waters of the Great Lakes. Lyman boats are rare in the western states. The boat is powered by a professionally restored 1956 Johnson Javelin, 30 HP. Restoration by Silver Lake Marine, Toronto, Canada. Period authentic seat covers by Boise Car Upholstery.



WOLVERINE 77 1956 14' Wagemaker Wolverine Runabout Owned by Harley & Cathy Reno

Purchased new by Harley's Uncle Paul & we have restored it in memory of Uncle Paul. We have the original brochures plus correspondence. It is 14 ft, mahogany, oak & pine. It took us 2 years to remove the original green, black, & white paint (have pictures). While sitting in Uncle Paul's garage, black goop from



the rafter dripped on this boat for 20 years. We thought we had met our Waterloo when we started on the inside so we took it to Don Hardy of McCall Boats to finish the work. Nothing had to be replaced, it is all original.

Lyman boats with their hull design and lapstrake construction were very popular for use on the rough waters in and around the Great Lakes. The life jackets and ski rope were also purchased in 1962, the same time as the Lyman.

Coeur Custom 30' Gentleman's Runabout. She is crafted from Sapele Mahogany, the boat is 30 feet long with an 8'6" beam.







The custom interior has pedestal captains seats and U-shape aft seating area. She is dressed out with a custom bent safety glass windshield bordered with a hand bent stainless steel framework. It has easy access to the cockpit through a side entry door, and is followed up with an integrated teak swim platform for access to the water.



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BLEW BY YOU 1947 22' Chris Craft U22 Owned by Gary & Cathy Lyons

The original boat was delivered to Cedar Rapids, Iowa. After many years of use and misuse, it was found in Riggins, Idaho in 2010 in poor condition. The original Chris Craft factory boat specifications indicated a mahogany deck, white hull and blue seating with blonde wood interior. We have kept the same theme here, only the interior configuration



has been changed to include captain's chairs, a mid-deck bench and a mahogany deck addition that partially covers the engine. We also added a swim deck to the exterior.

This was a very popular post-war boat. The Chris Craft Company manufactured 2082 boats between 1946 and 1954. This boat was completely restored from 2014-2015 by Chris Kirk and Gary Lyons at Chris' shop in McCall.

of Hebgen Lake, Montana.



So, I bought this boat five years ago as a recreational driver that wouldn't depreciate while I owned it. It was in adequate shape, floated and the engine started so I had no intention to do any restoration, just

use it and enjoy. However, owning a wooden boat compels one to join the boat club which compelled me to enter the Sandpoint ACBS boat show last year.

After seeing the gorgeous bright and shiny restorations on display, I realized, as my wife said, I was living in the ghettos with this boat, prompting an eight month refinishing of literally everything from the bilge, bottom and hull paint, new flooring, interior varnish and deck varnish, and a new windshield. A local graphic artist handpainted the name, The JOHN B, a loving tribute to my father who is suffering from severe Alzheimer's. He would have loved this boat.



IRISH CREAM 16' 1957 Century Resorter Owned by Don & Kathy Bailey

As far as we know, this boat is all original. The boat was purchased by us in August 2013. Hull #HD 57192—1957 Century Resorter Deluxe Utility.



JACK 1958 16' Mercury Sabre Owned by Barry McCahill, USCG Licensed Master

"Jack" was purchased in 2014 from Bobby Lawrence and had a complete make-over, including replacement of some of the wood and refinishing, a complete engine rebuild and new upholstery.

Mercury boats were made in Piru, California and while relatively rare in most parts of the country, there are still a few in California, Lake Tahoe and elsewhere in the Pacific Northwest. According to the late Bob Feltz, the Sabre was the "hottest Mercury of them all." "Jack" is named after my uncle, the late Jack Elliott, who owned Belle Island on Lake Cobbosseecontee, Maine. I was first introduced to classic boating as little boy who spent summers on that lake, and still return every year.

Like Paytette Lake, Lake Cobbosseecontee has a contingent of classic boats.

Owned by Bobby and Brandy Lawrence






WOODEN MISTRESS 1964 17' Century Ski Dart Owned by Jim & Claudia Foltz

The original owner of "Wooden Mistress" lived in McCall. Her three daughters learned to water ski on Payette Lake. After 20 years, Wooden Mistress was retired from McCall when the 2nd owner brought her to Boise and Spring Shores. During this time she was restored to her original glory. Jim and Claudia Foltz then bought her and returned her to beautiful Payette Lake.

MARY'S UTOPIA 1966 15' Century Resorter Owned by Jeff Nofsinger

I bought this boat at an auction and did not meet the previous owner.



Everything was removed from the hull. The boat was flipped upside down and all fiberglass removed. All bottom boards were removed and cleaned, frames cleaned, everything sealed with CPES, and boards reinstalled with 5200. Bottom was primed and

painted with Hard Racing Bronze. Hull boards were removed and cleaned. 3 boards were replaced. All boards and frames sealed with CPES, Installed with 5200. Hull was primed and painted with 9 coats of Oxford Green. All top deck screws were uncovered and tightened and then recovered. The top deck was sanded and 4 coats of varnish applied. The hull and bottom interior was painted in Century bilge paint.

Engine was completely re-built. It had a cracked block so that was welded up and all machine work done. Externally the engine has a new starter and alternator. Otherwise it is original.

Several pieces of chrome were re-chromed and the rest were polished. All stainless was polished. An interior and top deck kit was installed and all fittings installed. The dash is the original black vinyl from the factory.

All work except for the engine machining and the rechroming was done by the owner.

The original trailer was restored with upgraded lighting.





GRAN-DEL SPECIAL 1966 19' Century Arabian Owned by Jim & Kathy Grant

This 1966 Century Arabian runabout came from the Lake Tahoe area and was purchased by the current owner in 2009.

After transporting the craft from Truckee, CA to McCall, the boat has been under the restorative care of Jim Winslow.



Apostolia 1966 21' Chris Craft Super Sport Owned by Brian & Lana Ellsworth



After years of having fun with the boat, we decided to have some restoration done by McCall Boat Works. Original engine 327 with 259 horses was gone through, the exterior finishes were restored, the bottom was refastened, the transom was replaced and she was given a new name! We look forward to many more years of fun!

NIKOLINA 1969 21.5' Riva Olympic Owned by Bob & Nikki Robertson

This 1969 21 ft. 6" Riva Olympic was originally purchased in Monte Carlo by Patricia O'Connell Kane Matisse, an American. It was then shipped to New York in 1969. The name of the boat was called "Kane".



Patricia was formerly married to Roberto Matta, a famous surrealist painter from Chile. After her divorce from Matta she married Pierre Matisse in 1949. (Pierre was the youngest son of one of modern art's preeminent figures, French painter Henri Matisse.) Pierre, born in France, came to the US in 1924 where he began a distinguished 65 year career as an art dealer and collector.


Patricia, his second wife, died in 1972. Pierre then married Maria Gaetana Von Spreti who was an employee at the Pierre Matisse Gallery in the Fuller building in New York. They were together for 17 years until his death in 1989.


When Maria died in 2001 she left the bulk of her estate to the Pierre and Tana Matisse Foundation. The transaction information we found states that the Olympic #25 (then named "Ducky") was sold from "Riva Wooden Boats" in Langezwaag, Netherlands on January 15, 2003 to an American who planned to restore the boat.

The boat sat in storage until I purchased it in April 2016 and then the actual restoration began.

CUTWATER 1958 32' Chris Craft Cruiser Owned by Shore Lodge

Cutwater spent most of its life in Portland Oregon, arriving on Lake Coeur d'Alene in 1996. The boat was built of double planked mahogany in Pompano Beach, Florida with an interior of mahogany and a floor of teak and holly. The 32' Constellation was designed to be a luxury family day cruiser which is exactly what it is being used for today. Cutwater has been enjoying its new home this year on Payette Lake working as a cruise boat for Shore Lodge. The name Cutwater comes from the boat builder's term for the piece of metal that curves down the centerline of the bow and "cuts the water".



FINE & DANDY 2011 16.7' North Fork Boatworks Herreshoff Coquina Owned by Larry & Tenaya Wave

Fine and Dandy is a 16' 7" Herrshoff Cat Ketch with a 5' beam. The original design was from the 1880's and was purportedly Herrshoff's favorite day sailor. The plans were pur-

chased from Doug Hylan who adapted the originals from the Hart Nautical Museum at M.I.T. Fine and Dandy is built of Western Red Cedar, Honduras Mahogany, Marine Ply, Teak, Kapur, and Sitka Spruce.

She was launched in 2011 and has since proven to be a joy to sail. Downwind she can exceed hull speed and is easy to balance on all points of sail. In mild conditions the rope steering allows the helmsman to

steer from any position in the boat.





Fine and Dandy was awarded the Skipper's Choice Award at the Bass Lake Boat Show in 2011.

REBEL 1955 15.5' Glastron Owned by Dennis & Donna Taggart

This 1955 Glastron, 14 foot Fiberglass, Runabout, was the second boat of the Original Owners, Cameron and Faye Taggart of Donnelly, Idaho. It was purchased new and is a 1955 Vintage. The original Mercury Outboard was replaced by the current 60 hp Evinrude in the mid to late 60's.

It has always been in the family and passed to the Son, Daughter-in-law and Grandson, the Current Proud Owners, All the Owners and many of their friends and family spent years enjoying the boat on Payette Lake and on Cascade Lake after 1966. Dennis Taggart, (Son) learned to boat and ski behind this Glastron at about age 10. By the time of High School he, and his classmates, made frequent trips with the boat to Lucky Peak and to the Family Mountain Home in Donnelly, Donna (Daughter-in-law) and Devon



(Grandson), staying with the family tradition, learned to ski, tube and knee board behind this boat. We've all enjoyed inviting friends and family to Donnelly to "go boating" and the tradition continued.

Cameron and Faye continued to enjoy and entertain their friends and extended families until their latter years although their emphasis changed to fishing and cruising. The boat continued to be a center point of summer activities with Dennis' new family and old and new friends and cousins.

Sadly, with the Original Owner's advancing age and passing, and the grandson's departure to college, the boat fell into disuse. It was stored for many years and the condition declined from years of neglect. Now the Grandson is returning for visits, prompting the restoration of the original boat so the third, and someday, a fourth generation can build boat memories as well.

1956 16' Starline Owned by Richard & Amy Holm

Clint Warren (current owner's great uncle) purchased the boat only as a finished hull from the Starline company of Costa Mesa, California, in 1956. Warren, a mechanical engineer and owner of Cornell Pumps (a large industrial irrigation pump manufacturer) completed the boat in his Portland-based shop. The boat is powered by a 1956 Pontiac 316 that was

obtained from a then new automobile that had recently been wrecked. With speed in mind, the Pontiac is linked to a freestanding heavy-duty Paragon 3XE transmission then to a Walter v-drive. After completing initial water testing on the Willamette River in the spring of 1957 the boat was trailered to Payette Lake where it was used by the Warren family mainly for waterskiing through the late-1970s.


